CBC CONTINUES 5 PIN BOWLING COVERAGE

5 Pin Bowlings top prize, \$10,000, stayed in the west this year as **GEORGE CHURCH** of Minitonas, Manitoba bested our Don Betts in the final game. Betts earned his way onto the television show with a victory in the 1984 Old Vienna Open at Sherwood Lanes in Hamilton.

The television format is sudden death. Each bowler must win two preliminary games to advance to the semi finals and then win two more games to win the top prize. Bowling at Roxy Lanes in Winnipeg, Betts completely demolished the opposition in his first three games with individual scores of 316, 317 and 271 or a 301 average. His losing score in the last game was 178 but his four game score of 1082 (270 average) was still the highest in the event. The winner totalled only 930 (232 average) for his four games but rolled the strikes when he needed them.

This years show also included the first female as Cornerbrook, Newfoundland's Carol Lahey won the provincial roll-off to advance to the show through the qualifying round route. Carol can take some consolation as she lost to the eventual winner, George Church, 198 - 175, in week three.

All indications are that the bowling show will return next season. You can be sure that negotiations between the Bowling Proprietors' Association of Canada and the CBC include the possibility of more televised shows, the inclusion of a separate women's competition and even some exposure of 5 pin's very large youth programme. At this time, while we do not know the outcome of these negotiations, everyone should take the time to write the CBC to express their appreciation for this year's show and a request for more next season. 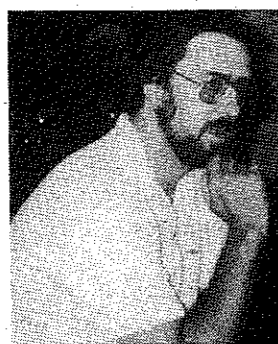
